11. I <u>got up</u> at 7 <u>last night</u>	Past simple	Finished time
12. I'll <u>see</u> Alexandro on Wednesday	Future simple	*Predictions *Refusing *Deciding at the moment *Promising
13. They're <u>flying</u> to Rio next week	Present continuous	*Future definite plans *Actions happening in the now
14. Julia <u>was eating</u> when the accident happened	Past continuous	To emphasis duration in the past
15. I <u>am going</u> to cook paella tomorrow	Future plans	Plans and intensions for the future
16. I <u>haven't finished</u> my dinner yet	Present perfect	Unfinished time Unfinished actions
17. She <u>has been living</u> there since 2010	Present perfect continuous	To say how long things have been going on up to now; unfinished actions:
18. By 5o'clock we <u>had</u> already <u>eaten</u>	Past perfect	To talk about an earlier past time when we are already talking about the past

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
